As an emergency physician and Deputy Chief of Staff at Four Counties Health Services, I am pleased to have the opportunity to help support the Four Counties Health Services Foundation in its current fund raising initiative that will allow us to upgrade and purchase new **Dr. Dryer** *MC, CM, FRCPC* Digital X-ray equipment.

We have a great facility and wonderful staff here at Four Counties Health Services but it is essential to update our aging diagnostic equipment if we are going to be able to continue to provide the highest standard of care to our community and your families. I am sure you know that obtaining images of different parts of the body is essential to helping us make the right diagnosis in a timely fashion. Soon after I came to Four Counties Health Services in 2002 the hospital had just installed what was then state of the art diagnostic imaging equipment. That equipment has served us well since that time. However, it has reached its natural life expectancy and needs to be replaced with new digital equipment.

New digital equipment will provide us with clearer images, with a lower radiation dose, and will make it easier for our radiology technologists and you, our patients, to have these X-rays taken.

I implore you to please contribute to this important campaign so that we may continue to be able to provide top-notch care for you and your family at Four Counties Health Services, your community hospital.

It is all about Quality and Safety

The purchase of a new digital X-ray suite and portable digital radiography unit will provide:

Improved Quality of Imaging - the digital image will appear on the technologist's screen within seconds of taking the exposure (similar to a digital camera). The image has no loss of information in processing and is at the highest quality and clarity for the radiologist to interpret.

Increased Safety to the Patient - new digital systems will deliver less radiation to the patient.

Faster Imaging - digital X-rays are completed with a 40-60% reduction in exam time. This is especially important for the comfort and care of the acutely ill patient. A faster exam time means a shorter wait for diagnosis and treatment for you and your family.

Improved Accessibility - the new equipment provides easier access for all patients to the X-ray table. The technologist is able to easily obtain complex views for wheelchair and trauma patients.

Increased Safety for Staff - the new equipment is much more ergonomic and decreases the risk of technologist's injury. The constant moving of the older cumbersome equipment can wear on body joints and may lead to repetitive strain injuries.

Finally - the digital portable unit which "travels to the patient's bedside" will offer all the above advantages for a patient not able to be transported to the X-ray suite due to the nature of their illness.

This technology comes at a substantial cost. The capital cost for Digital X-ray System, Portable Radiography and Turnkey Install is \$700,000. Community and donor support are vital in helping achieve targeted goal of \$700,000 this year.
